In Honor of: Gale Osterloh (1917-1985)

Gale Osterloh was a long-time advocate for Postal Workers and the first manager of Community 1st Credit Union. He was also one of the founders of the Credit Union Executives Society (CUES) and was inducted into the CUES Hall of Fame in 1988. CUES is a foundation that is dedicated to educating credit union leaders and providing them with the resources they need to assist in achieving their full potential.





In Honor of: Wilbur Woodrow Walton (1916 - 1999)

Wilbur Woodrow Walton was a Korean War veteran and truly believed in the credit union difference. He advocated for Employment Security Department employees and worked alongside Generations Credit Union to ensure their best interests were always represented. Walton was known for being adventurous, a lifetime learner, and an active volunteer in the community. He was a strong believer in personal growth and had an unmatched sense of humor.

Both honorees embodied special and unique characteristics and were true believers in the credit union movement and difference. They were active volunteers in their communities.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION / INSTRUCTIONS:

Rules & Restrictions:

Applicant must be a member (or immediate family of a member) of Community 1st Credit Union or Generations, a Division of Community 1st as of December 31st the year prior to high school graduation. The member / family must be a graduating high school senior and seeking to further their education, skills or vocational development at any accredited educational institution. These funds may be used for tuition, supplies and books. Any certified education or training school qualifies. If the student is granted the scholarship and upon enrollment in their school of choice, they should contact the credit union with the school's name, address and their student ID number. A check will then be made payable to and mailed directly to the college, university, community college or vocational / technical school of choice.

How applications will be judged:

A professional in the field of academics who is also an impartial third party will judge applications in conjunction with credit union volunteers.

Winners will be selected based on the following:

Student Essay, academic achievements, demonstration of leadership and participation in activities.
